The Royal Bhutan Army (RBA; Dzongkha: འཇམ་དཔལ་སྤྱན་དྲོལ་མཆོག་གི་མཁའ་འགྲུབ་ལུང་ལྷན་ཁག་, romanized: bStan-srung dmag-sde) [1] is a branch of the armed forces of the Kingdom of Bhutan responsible for maintaining the country's territorial integrity and sovereignty against security threats. Notable locations include the Farkhor Air Base in Tajikistan, as well as facilities in Mauritius (Agalega), Seychelles (Assumption Island), and Oman.
